

Assignment 7: Building your web page

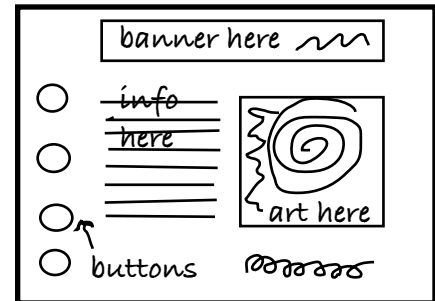
Due: March 31 start of class

Create the "first draft" of a web site with 3 or more pages for yourself around a specific subject matter of which you are interested in. Use Dreamweaver to create your website. Create & format your graphics using photoshop. Start by filling in the flowchart and storyboard diagrams on the next pages to pre-plan your website before you start actually creating it.

some page examples:

- main "home" page
- links page
- about page
- contact page
- photos page

storyboard example:



version 1 (due in 2 weeks)

placeholders / space for banner (in the form of a still jpg sized 640 x 100 pixels)

photo (homepage graphic) (sized 300 pixels by 300 pixels)

link to your photo gallery which pops up in a new window (from previous assignment) (text links)

links page (sites related to your subject matter)

links to your myspace, youtube, facebook or tribe page (if you have one) or other personal interest web pages

include the "storyboard and flowchart planning papers" in the paper turned in with your CD jewelcase

(This project will be draft 1, for what will later be your final class project)

to turn in completed assignment: burn entire folder containing your web site files onto a CD, place in jewelcase with attached papers for grading, storyboard and flowchart folded neatly in the jewelcase. Label the CD clearly with your name, DM 77 and "web site version 1"

final version of your web project due at end of semester must include:

animated banner (on final version)

photo (homepage graphic)

web video & song (mp3)

animated slide show "widget" from slide.com

link to your photo gallery (from previous assignment) (button links)

links page

link to your myspace, youtube, facebook or tribe page (if you have one)

Preparation: Watch the videos at AtomicLearning. First watch the Mac version DreamWeaver CS3 Intro: sections A #1 - #7, Getting Started, B. Designing and Viewing, C. Images, D. Links, G. Lists and Tables. Then do sections B: Design Basics & C: Working with Tables. You may (optional) also refer to the Dreamweaver Help.

Storyboard: Sketch out and write material for your home page, using the attached storyboard & flowcharts (name the file index.html). It must include a photo, an animated banner, a podcast, and some text. Leave a little room at the top for a 640 x 100 pixel high banner. Use a lot of the concepts that you just studied. A menu should have Links to your gallery, favorite web sites, your myspace and youtube pages, for a PodCast and movie, and if you do not have an introduction or bio on the home page, a link to a separate bio page would be great.

At home or in the lab, do a rough sketch of your home page layout and a storyboard (see StoryBoard Doctor and <http://www.mcli.dist.maricopa.edu/authoring/studio/index.html>). Also plan for an animated banner (80 pixels high by 832 wide) to go on top of the home page. This can be animated text or a logo of some sort. People seeing it for the first time should get an idea of what you or your story is about. Note that the home page with a link to you gallery, but without the banner will be due in one+ weeks. Be ready to show it in class.

Draft 1 of this web project is worth 10 points total. Because this is an on-going project and this grade is based on progress, late assignment 7s will not receive points, even if credit for subsequent drafts is given

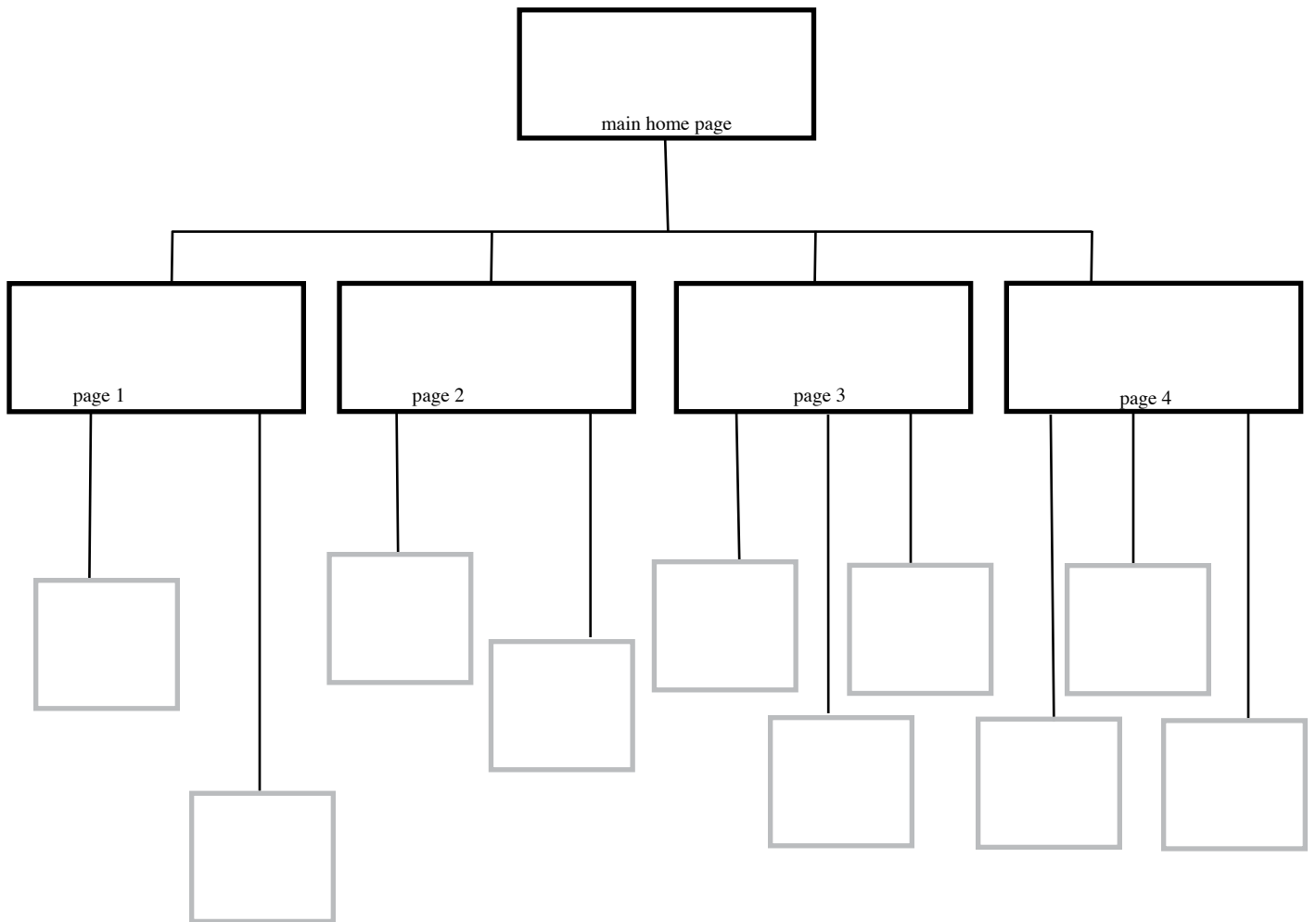

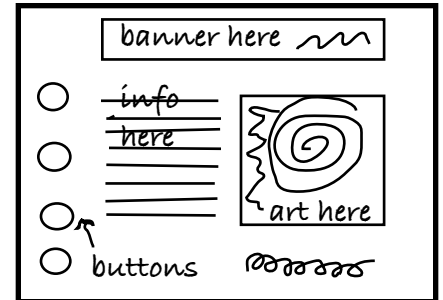
